<u>Governor Kemp Extends State of Emergency Through May</u> 13



The governor announced this morning that he will be extending Georgia's state of public health emergency through May 13. During this time, the governor's emergency powers will also be extended, including his ability to suspend laws and impose other restrictions to contain the COVID-19 pandemic. This extension makes it unnecessary for the General Assembly to reconvene, and the announcement was made alongside Lg. Gov. Geoff Duncan and House Speaker David Ralson, who have both agreed not to call a special legislative session that was expected next week.
