On Friday, March 13, The Georgia General Assembly suspended the 2020 legislative session indefinitely due to concerns about COVID-19. This doesn't end the legislative session, only postpones it. When they do reconvene, it will be for the thirtieth legislative day. Legislators had until March 12, "Crossover Day," to pass their bills out of their chamber and to the other chamber for consideration.
